In-Text Citations

Single Author:

Approximately two thirds (18 million) acres of Mississippi is covered with forest land (Londo, 2000).

OR

According to Londo (2000), approximately two thirds of Mississippi is covered with forest land.

Two Authors:

Direct contact NIPF landowner education programs in Mississippi have traditionally consisted of landowner short courses and field days (Londo & Monaghan, 2002).

OR

Londo and Monaghan (2002) state direct contact NIPF landowner education programs in Mississippi traditionally consisted of short courses and field days.

More than Two Authors:

Soil respiration is directly affected by temperature (Londo et al. 1999)

OR

According to Londo et al. (1999), soil respiration rates are directly related to soil temperature.
