Judith Hartmann, Chief Financial Officer of ENGIE, the world's largest independent power producer and one of largest suppliers of energy services, will be visiting campus on August 29. With the new energy world characterized by decarbonization, decentralization, and digitalization, ENGIE's ambition is to be a forerunner in the transition to a low-carbon

economy – providing access to sustainable energy, climate-change mitigation and adaptation, and the rational use of resources. The company employs 153,000 people in 70 countries and achieved revenues of approximately \$80 billion in 2016.

ENGIE, in partnership with Axium Infrastructure US, is now managing Ohio State's energy system and will be installing energy conservation measures to improve the university's energy efficiency by at least 25 percent within 10 years.

Over her career, Judith, who holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Vienna, has worked in five countries for organizations including Transport Canada, Walt Disney, GE, and the global multimedia, services, and education company Bertelsmann.
