ABOUT THE CLOVERBUD PROGRAM

The 4-H Cloverbud program exists as a distinctive component within the total 4-H youth development program. It is designed as a non-formal approach to developing the confidence, social skills, decision making abilities, subject matter knowledge, and physical skills of kindergarten through second grade youth. As youth begin their 4-H Cloverbud experience, they take part in a unique blend of activities and opportunities specially designed for their age level.







HOW DO CLOVERBUDS PARTICIPATE?

The 4-H Cloverbud program allows for and encourages creativity and play. It is an excellent opportunity for children to reach their fullest potential because early life experiences, even subtle ones, affect future development. Children are involved in noncompetitive group activities, rather than individual projects. In doing so, the children learn life skills, which include getting along with others and feeling good about themselves.

CAN CLOVERBUDS EXHIBIT AT THE COUNTY FAIR?

Yes, Cloverbuds are encouraged to exhibit something from their club activities at the county fair. However, Cloverbud exhibitions must be noncompetitive and for an exhibition only. Our county also offers this at our fair for Cloverbuds:
