Quality Improvement

Project Participants: Gallia, Hocking, Jackson, Lawrence, Meigs, Perry, Pike, Scioto, Ross, and Vinton Counties and Portsmouth City Health Departments

This project was made possible by the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) with funding from the Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE) as part of the Ohio Local Public Health Accreditation Support Project.

Quality improvement Training

This was a collaborative effort of the health departments listed above. Each Health Department received both in person training and technical assistance from the OSU College of Public Health Center for Public Health Practice. Each Health Department received 8 hours of (group) training in Columbus and 6 hours of individual technical assistance.

Why Was it Selected?

Quality Improvement was selected because everyone involved agreed that it was the logical next step having just completed Performance Management training.

- None of the Health Departments in the group had attempted to do QI in the past.
- None of the Health Departments had staff that were trained to do QI.
- No matter where each Health
 Department was in the
 Accreditation process, all agreed
 that QI was the next step toward a
 good PM / QI plan.

What We Did

In person training was provided January 22, 2018 by from the OSU College of Public Health Center for Public Health Practice. Kathy Lordo was assigned to provide technical assistance.

What We Made

Each Health Department came away with varied degrees of understanding of Quality Improvement and how to implement it. Persons trained in the in-person sessions were able to take the lessons learned back to their respective Health Departments and train the rest of the staff.

- Ross County established a QI committee and developed a QI plan which they submitted to the Board.
- Vinton County chose to use the Lean Ohio model and developed a story board to show the process.
- Portsmouth City used Kathy's guidance to go back to their original plan and combine Performance Management and Quality Improvement.

Lessons Learned

Staff time hard to dedicate towards plan development and TA in addition to daily required activities.


Time frame window to use the peer coach contract for 4hs of TA was unable to be utilized.

Communication made to TA provider (Kathy Lordo) but was unable to find a date and time to complete TA hours by deadline.

Portsmouth City Health District decided that their original plan of combining PM & QI was a good choice.
