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

Clark, Champaign, Darke, Greene, Miami, Montgomery, Preble, and Shelby Counties

I. INTRODUCTION

This is the plan for the public health epidemiological response to non-communicable and communicable disease outbreaks, including bioterrorism, and health effects from environmental sources. The scope of this plan is to focus on regional cross jurisdictional epidemiological investigations and support. This plan augments the Ohio Department of Health Emergency Response Plan, West Central Ohio Local Public Health Agencies' Emergency Response Plans and the Ohio Infectious Disease Control Manual. This plan is not meant to replace existing relationships between Infection Preventionists and Public Health Communicable Disease Nurses, nor replace any specific agencies' plan or response. No part of this plan shall, nor be interpreted to, discount any established regulations regarding disease investigation, reporting or disclosure.

II. APPROVAL

The Regional Epidemiological Disease Specialists (REDS) and at least two adjunct members, individually representing Regional Infectious Diseases Specialists (RIDS) are responsible for annually reviewing the plan. Nurses that also are in the epidemiology role may serve as both adjunct and full REDS committee members. The updated plan will be forwarded to the regional health commissioners for approval.

III. EVENT DETECTION AND SURVEILLANCE

- A. Each local public health agency will be responsible for their surveillance procedures. (Appendices I and II)
- B. Early event detection may occur from any source (for example but not limited to:)
 - 1) Local, Regional, or State health department routine surveillance
 - 2) Active surveillance
 - 3) EpiCenter notification
 - 4) Lab result notification
 - 5) Astute clinician
 - 6) Law enforcement
 - 7) Concerned citizens

IV. REGIONAL EPIDEMIOLOGICAL RESPONSE

- A. The Regional Epidemiological Response Plan (RERP) may be activated upon request from any local health department with appropriate approval. Possible reasons for activation include:
- 1) Inadequate resources to conduct an adequate investigation at the local level.
 - 2) A suspected outbreak of a disease of regional significance
 - 3) A request for assistance from a state or federal authority.
- B. Response will be initiated through communication to any of the following (also see Appendix IV):
- 1) Epidemiologist in the region
 - 2) Regional Public Health Coordinator
 - 3) Public Health Communicable Disease Nurse in the region
 - 4) Health Commissioner in the region
- C. The Regional Public Health Coordinator will be notified and in turn will notify Health Commissioners and other key stakeholders.
- D. Upon notification, the Regional Epidemiological Task Force (RETF) will be activated (Appendix III).
- 1) The RETF will assess the event to determine the impact on public health and assist in determining the level of response necessary.
 - 2) The RETF may provide recommendations on sanitation, decontamination, control.
 - 3) The RETF will assist in providing the appropriate epidemiological resources for investigation of disease outbreaks across multiple jurisdictions in West Central Ohio.
- E. Resources beyond the West Central Region may be obtained from other regions or at the state level. (Appendix V)
- F. Outside Agencies (Appendix VI)
- 1) Outside agencies may be asked to implement daily surveillance activities.
 - a) The Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association (GDAHA) should be used as a liaison to area hospitals.
 - 2) GDAHA member hospitals, urgent care centers, health care providers, coroner's office, and other stakeholders may be contacted for additional surveillance and response activities.
- G. Notifications
- 1) The RETF will report the status of the investigation to the affected jurisdiction. There are two channels of communication:
 - a) Formal communication through the ICS structure.
 - b) Informal communication across sections and to external partners.
 - 2) Communication to the public must be through the PIO.
 - a) A designated RETF member will act as epidemiological liaison between the RETF and the PIO.
 - b) A designated RETF member will be the liaison to the Planning Section
 - 3) Communication to federal and other state agencies should be accomplished through the Ohio Department of Health.
 - 4) While communication and notification of those affected and/or their close contacts may occur as part of the public health management process official death notifications are not part of this plan.

Regional Epidemiological Response Plan Appendix I

Local Surveillance Responsibilities

- A. Disease Reporting
 - 1) Each local health department will facilitate consistent disease reporting and training within their organization.
 - 2) Standard case definitions will be used per the State of Ohio Infectious Disease Control Manual (IDCM) when applicable.
- B. Ohio Disease Reporting System (ODRS)
 - 1) Surveillance of ODRS – Under normal operations ODRS will be routinely checked by an assigned individual at each local health department. More frequent checks may be required to conduct surveillance and respond to potential outbreaks.
 - 2) Threshold indicators for reportable disease will vary with disease activity and surveillance alert levels.
 - a) Each county will be responsible for determining threshold indicators.
 - b) ODH estimation of flu activity may be used for assessing the risk of regional activity.
- C. EpiCenter and NRDM
 - 1) Surveillance using EpiCenter and/or other surveillance systems. Under normal operations these systems will be routinely checked by an assigned individual at each local health department. More frequent checks may be required to conduct surveillance and respond to potential outbreaks.
 - 2) Thresholds are pre-established by EpiCenter and will generate an anomaly when that threshold is exceeded. Categories of syndromes, symptoms, and pharmaceuticals can be found in Appendix IV.
- D. Active surveillance may occur through coordination with local community partners as needed.
 - 1) Active surveillance will be hypotheses driven.
 - 2) Initial information will be used to narrow down the hypotheses and exposure assessment data collection questions.
- E. Local epidemiologic investigations may trigger the following responses:
 - 1) A public health notice may be issued to all communicable disease nurses and epidemiologists in the region if it is deemed appropriate based on the investigation.
 - 2) If the outbreak investigation can be handled by a Local Health Department (LHD) without extending to a regional response, the LHD will follow their procedures.
 - 3) If the outbreak investigation is an expanding or complex event a LHD may request assistance from the West Central Regions LHDs by activating the Regional Epidemiological Response Plan.
 - 4) If the outbreak investigation expands or increases in complexity, investigators at West Central Ohio LHDs may request assistance from other investigators outside their region in the same manner they would from colleagues within the region, as described in this document.

Regional Epidemiological Task Force (RETF)

A. Regional Epidemiological Task Force (RETF)

- 1) Scope: The RETF will assess the event to determine the impact on public health as well as provide recommendations on sanitation, decontamination, control, etc. The response is dependent on the number, nature, and forecast of illness within spatial and temporal parameters.
- 2) Purpose: The purpose for the RETF is to provide for the appropriate epidemiological resources for investigation of disease outbreaks across multiple jurisdictions in West Central Ohio.

B. Overview of the West Central Ohio RETF

1) Team Structure

- a) The RETF may initially be comprised of a single person
- b) The RETF may be comprised of communicable disease, environmental health, epidemiology, and clerical staff.
- c) Activation of the task force members must be accomplished in coordination with each respective LHD Health Commissioner or other authorized agent.
- d) The county with the index case will take the initial lead.
- e) Changes during the course of the event may necessitate reassigning the lead role considering multiple case locations, resources available, command structure, etc.
- f) The assignment will be made by mutual consent among the Public Health Epidemiologists and the LHD Health Commissioner or other with the authority to do so for the proposed new lead with the assistance of the Regional Public Health Coordinator.
- g) Specific roles for data management, surveillance, contact tracing, investigation and laboratory response will be assigned as needed.
- h) An incident command structure is recommended within the lead organization.
- i) The RETF may request assistance for additional personnel through proper chain of command.
- j) The RETF will be modular and may expand and contract depending on the incident/emergency.
- k) Public Health Epidemiologists may recommend active surveillance and/or investigation depending on the scenario(s) within the region.
- l) The RETF will use uniform data collection tools (forms, databases, on-line data collection tools, etc...) for use in any investigation(s) for which the RERP is activated.
- m) The RETF may appoint a liaison to consult with other regional and/or state epidemiology response teams for survey design and analysis as needed.

2) Team Support Functions during or prior to an event necessitating activation of this plan.

- a) Collaboration on training, information sharing and outbreak investigation.
- b) Provide training on ODRS, surveillance, outbreak investigation, and data entry as needed.

- c) Participate in Public Health, Early Event Detection, and Active Surveillance activities as noted in section III.
- d) Review and approve disease investigation protocols including the identification and/or development of appropriate tracking forms, databases and other tools.
- e) Advise in the appropriateness and implementation of regional isolation and quarantine measures.
- f) Plan, develop and participate in drills and exercises.
- g) Participate in regional public health investigations. Regional disease investigation may include evaluation of regional public health initiatives, population adverse health effects from mass prophylaxis, and chronic disease effects occurring in the population after disasters.


3) Additional RETF roles:

- a) Enhanced surveillance and case investigations.
- b) Recommendation of transmission interruption procedures.
- c) Characterization of the ill by person, place, and time.
- d) Coordination of surveillance activities with Communicable Disease and Environmental Health staff(s).
- e) Medical Confirmation and Sample Submission - The ODH IDCM will be used to guide medical confirmation and sample submission.
- f) The RETF may coordinate and recommend appropriate sample selection, specimen collection and submission.
- g) The RETF may recommend sampling of the regional population for ascertainment of seroprevalence, disease occurrence, adverse events or other criteria as appropriate to determine the extent of testing necessary.
- h) All specimens collected during an outbreak will be documented as appropriate.
- i) Collected samples will be kept secure. Chain of custody issues will be ascertained and policies followed.
- j) The RETF may recommend implementation of control and prevention measures on a regional level.
- k) The RETF may provide population based spatial and temporal targets for public health activities throughout the region.
- l) The RETF may make recommendations for regional mass public education through schools; businesses; the media; “infomercials”; and frequently visited gathering places such as movie theaters, malls, or restaurants.
- m) Provide consultation as requested by the Incident Commander to community and business organizations.
