## **CLERMONT COUNTY 4-H HONOR CLUB**

**DUE: October 11, to the Clermont County Extension Office** 

What is a 4-H Honor Club? The Honor Club program is not a competition between 4-H clubs, but a standard of excellence for all clubs to achieve. Document club activities from October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2019. There are 14 requirements that are mandatory, which are marked with a clover \*\*. Additionally, clubs must meet 14 of the 32 requirements that are not mandatory. Honor club applications and supporting documentation are due to the Clermont County Extension Office by Friday, October 11. Honor Clubs will be recognized at the 4-H Volunteer Appreciation Banquet on November 15.

## Completing the Record Sheet:

- Only clubs that complete this record sheet and return it to the Extension Office by October 11, 2019, will be eligible to receive the honor club award. No late honor club applications will be considered. Document your 4-H club activities from October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2019.
- Mark all appropriate activities and provide the requested information. If supplemental information and officer books are not provided, the application will not be accepted.
- The 4-H club president and advisor must sign the completed form. Both signatures verify participation in activities indicated.
