## CALL FOR PROPOSALS – UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH AND MENTORSHIP GRANTS

The Global Mobility Project invites applications for our **undergraduate research and mentorship** grants. We seek proposals from faculty and student teams with a goal of training undergraduate students to perform research and creative work, as well as guiding their projects. We encourage faculty to nominate promising students and urge students to identify faculty as their mentors.

We shall consider applications related to any aspect of mobility and migration, regardless of geographical, historical, or thematic focus. The grants are open to all undergraduate students at Ohio State University.

Our grants offer funding of up to \$2,000 to be used toward the completion of a research-based paper, digital humanities project, or creative work in an arts discipline. The funds could be for travel to archives or library collections, the recording of interviews, the acquisition of research materials not available at Ohio State, or other relevant uses. All funding will include an additional stipend of \$1,000 for faculty mentorship for the duration of the project. We expect to award up to 4 undergraduate research and mentorship grants.

## To Apply:

Faculty mentors should submit, in collaboration with the student mentee, a 2-page double-spaced project description, including a concise statement of the project's impact on student research/creative skills, as well as any relevant student experience. Also attach an itemized budget of your expenses, a schedule for project completion, a one page faculty CV, and an unofficial undergraduate transcript to <a href="mailto:globalmobility@osu.edu">globalmobility@osu.edu</a>. Please use the subject heading "Undergraduate Grant Proposal."

Be advised that per diems are not permitted under this program. Funds cannot be used to hire personnel or purchase equipment.

All student/faculty teams will participate in the events of The Global Mobility Project, including the annual reception (date in April 2018 to be announced) where they will present their work. During the award period, all student awardees will write a blog post for our website, detailing their projects and how they utilized their grants.

## Application deadline:

13 November 2017 for projects to be completed by the end of the Spring semester 2018. We are happy to discuss other appropriate deadlines if the student will be completing a project that will require longer time (Honors Theses, distinction projects, independents studies etc.)
