- one blog post at u.osu.edu/montreal about your activities, preferably with photos and comments on what you found stimulating, unnerving, or educational;

QUEBEC CITY TOUR

Duration: 2 1/2 hours approx.

Rendez-vous with history

Explore this vibrant city with its fascinating history and provincial French flavour. Your guide will take you back over three centuries through Vieux Québec quarter within its massive fortifications. You will enjoy a relaxing drive through the only walled city north of Mexico which prompted UNESCO to declare it a World heritage Treasure.

Other Key sites on your tour

The Château Frontenac, most photographed hotel in the world, will be offering a panoramic view of lower town by the St-Lawrence River and the town of Lévis across the river.

The Place Royale, where Samuel De Champlain built his habitation in 1608, has beautifully restored 17th and 18th century architecture. Stop and enjoy 45 minutes walking guided visit of the oldest quarter with the narrow streets and breathe taking architecture.

The bus tour will permit us to see, the fortifications, the Port of Québec, the Notre Dame Basilica, the Price building (first skyscraper), the Parliament building (picture stop).

The Plains of Abraham, site on which Canada's history was rewritten, It is where in 1759 Great Britain and France battled for mastery of North America. We will make a picture stop at the Promenade des Gouverneurs, highest point above the St-Lawrence River. You will enjoy a beautiful view of the citadelle, part of the fortifications, the River and the Battlefield ground. We will continue on the Grande Allée, considered the Champs Élysées of Québec City with its quaint hotels, sidewalk cafés and restaurants.

Join the historic tour and enjoy the best of Québec City. You will get an overview of its timeless architecture, its lovely setting on the St-Lawrence River and its irrepressible joie de vivre.
