After the Provost announced his departure to become the chancellor at the University of Arkansas, Katherine was recruited by Ohio Health's corporate office. Continuing her career as a leadership-level executive assistant, she will be the Executive Assistant to Ohio Health's Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. Prior to coming to Ohio State, she worked for Ohio Health, The Wellington School, COSI Columbus, the Columbus Museum of Art and AmeriFlora '92.

Choosing to become an administrative professional midway through her career, Margard is passionate about elevating the profession, sharing professional development opportunities with peers, and spreading the message that the administrative profession is a profession to be respected and valued. When the opportunity to form a professional development and networking organization arose, Katherine was the first to offer her time and innovative ideas. With her dedication and strong leadership, OSUAP grew from 30 members at the first meeting in 2010, to over 300 members from the university and medical center. 


