## Portage County Fair 4-H Educational Booth Competition

Each 4-H club may choose to present an educational booth in the Hubbard Building, which reflects the work done by the 4-H club members during the course of the year. The display may include any items that reflect projects that individual members or groups of members have completed. This may include actual projects (other than food items or weapons), posters, display boards, pictures, scrapbooks, or other collections that reflect the completed work.

### Rules for booth displays:

- ✿ Each 4-H club will display a card in the lower left corner of the booth, which needs to include: club name, advisor(s) name(s), and club enrollment numbers.
- ✿ Each project, poster, display board, etc. must include a tag that displays the first name(s) of the member(s) who completed them.
- ✿ Displays may not extend beyond the perimeter of the booth dividers.
- ✿ Clubs may begin setting up booths beginning 9 am Friday, August 17<sup>th</sup>.
- ✿ All booths should be maintained until close of Fair, Sunday, August, 26<sup>th</sup>.

### Judging of the educational displays:

- ✿ Displays must be completed (and the surrounding area cleaned) by 7:30 pm, Monday, August 20<sup>th</sup>.
- ✿ Judging will be conducted by the Extension Office beginning at 8 pm on Monday, August 20<sup>th</sup>.
- ✿ Judging criteria are on the front of this page.

### Awards to be given:

Rotating Champion/Reserve Banner:	Top two scoring booths in each category
Blue Ribbon:	90-100 total points
Red Ribbon:	80-89 total points
Participation Certificate:	All entries
