Those who participate will help with the development of the first diagnostic assessment of • mental health disorders among youth with ID.

Participating youth and their caregiver will each receive reimbursement for their time in the form of a \$50.00 gift card. Participation in this study is voluntary. All participants' information will be kept confidential. Participation has no bearing on participants' status in any program or referring organization.
