### General Jr. Fair Rules

- Final Decisions on Rules: Fair Board rules must be followed in all cases.
- All livestock must submit Pen Reservation Forms to Senior Fair Board—see form for due dates. 2.
- 3. Eligibility: Any regularly enrolled 4-H/FFA members may exhibit and show his or her livestock projects at the Barlow Fair, Washington County Fair, or both and be eligible to receive awards at either or both fairs.
- All 4-H exhibits must be removed from buildings by 6 pm Sunday...
- 5. Animal Health Requirements: Exhibitors are responsible for reading and following health requirements as defined in each Open Class species department of the Barlow Senior Fair Book.
- Still Project Exhibitor Awards: Each Jr. Fair exhibitor displaying a still project in a club booth will receive a \$3.00 exhibit award per project, with a maximum premium payout on five (5) still projects. A ribbon will be awarded to each exhibitor.
- 7. Livestock Exhibitor Awards: If exhibited in a Class:

Dairy & Beef (per animal)- \$7.00, Sheep & Goat (per animal)-\$5.00, Market Ducks (per pen)-\$3.00

### Fair Showmanship Rules (Beef, Dairy, Sheep, Goat, Rabbit, Poultry)

- Pen Reservations due date is listed on forms and on 4-H Calendar. Forms are located in this guide and available online at: www.washington.osu.edu
- Open to all Washington County Jr Fair Exhibitors enrolled in the project through their 4-H Club and FFA Chapter. (Poultry showmanship is open to all Washington County and surrounding county Jr fair exhibitors 4-H Age)
- Exhibitors must show own animals.
- Showmanship Awards: \$1.00 participation award and Placing awards: 1st-\$5, 2nd-\$4, 3rd-\$3, 4th-\$2, 5th-\$1
- 5. Age Divisions (as of January 1): Senior: 13-18 years; Jr.: 8-12 years (Beef, Dairy, Sheep, Goat)
- 6. Age divisions are as follows (all ages are as of January 1): Senior 15-18; Intermediate 12-14; and Jr. 8-11. (rabbit, poultry)
- Seniors will show first followed by intermediate and juniors. All poultry and rabbit exhibitors must show in showmanship to be eligible to participate in the poultry or rabbit show.
- Feeder calf projects not permitted to show in Junior Fair Beef Breeding show at Barlow Independent Fair.

# Fair Poultry Department

### **Poultry Show**

- 1. Market Duck Pen Reservations will be collected during skillathon. Fancy Poultry pen reservations due date is listed on forms. Forms are located in this guide and available online at: www.washington.osu.edu
- The American Standard of Perfection as revised by the American Poultry Association will be the guide for the judges in awarding premiums.
- Single birds cannot compete in Trio. Birds in Trio cannot compete as a single.
- 4. The terms Cock & Hen are defined as Birds hatched prior to January 1 the year of the fair. The terms Cockerel & Pullet are defined as birds hatched after January 1 the year of the fair. A Trio consists of one Cock or Cockerel and two Hens or Pullets.
- Exhibitor must show own animal, unless prior arrangements are made with senior fair board chairperson.
- Each exhibitor will feed and care for his own stock. If not taken care of properly, exhibitor may be asked to remove ani-
- 7. Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits, but the Fair Board will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.

# Jr. Fair Rabbit Department

### Rabbit Show

Saturday, immediately following showmanship

- 1. Limit: Two entries per class for any breed per exhibitor (i.e. 2 Sr. Bucks, 2 Sr. Does, 2 Jr. Bucks etc.)
- 2. Note: Variety of colors are considered as different classes of breed (i.e. 2 Sr. Does Black N. Zealand, 2 Sr. Does White N. Zealand, But Best of Breed for N. Zealand's would include all 1st place varieties of N. Zealand).
- 3. All rabbits must be tattooed to enter.
- 4. Exhibitor must show own animal, unless prior arrangements are made with senior fair board chair person.
- 5. Breeds will be those listed in the Standard of Perfection and a mixed breed class.
- 6. Each exhibitor will feed and care for his own stock. If not taken care of properly, exhibitor may be asked to leave fair.
- 7. Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits, but the fair board will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.
- 8. Special Note: All entries of rabbits will be accepted without certificates provided the rabbit has not been exposed to and entries do not show any evidence of any contagious, infectious, or communicable disease, subject to the approval of the official fair veterinarian or fair representative (i.e. mites, wry neck, open sore hocks, colds, etc.).
- 9. Premiums paid as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> \$3.00; 2<sup>nd</sup> \$2.00; 3<sup>rd</sup> \$1.00 along with a ribbon.
- 10.Participation award—None.
- 11.Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex trophies will be given in the top 16 breeds exhibited. A Best of Show winner will be selected from the Best of Breed winners.
- 12. Class Descriptions are as follows:

01- Senior Buck over 6 months

03-Senior Doe over 6 months 09-Jr. Buck up to 6 months

05-Intermediate Buck 6 - 8 months

07- Intermediate Doe 6 – 8 months

011- Jr. Doe up to 6 months

101-Litter of 3 or more 2 to 4 months

102-Doe with Litter of 3 or more 6 to 8 weeks

Tag-in & Possession: Tag-in on Saturday, July 16, 8-10:00 am at Barlow Fair grounds. Must have a halter on animal. Exhibitor

not required to be present – only the animal. Scrapie tags are required for does and wethers.

# Allowed: Tag-in up to 3 sell 2 (3 if selling 2 or 2 if selling 1). Each exhibitor is limited to showing and selling only 2

market animals/pens (any combination) at the Barlow Independent Fair.

Animal Age/Breed: Born between Jan 1 (year of fair) and April 30<sup>th</sup> to make weight by fair. Recommended no later than

March 1. 100% dairy doe or castrated male with NO MEAT characteristics. Determined by panel, over-

seen by fair board.

**Pictures:** Friday during the Market Dairy Goat Show.

Born & Bred / Breed Verification: Card due to OSU Extension by third Saturday in July (dairy goat tag in), No late cards will be ac-

cepted.

**Dehorning:** Goats may be dehorned but not required.

Male Anatomy: Responsibility of Exhibitor & Parents-Castration must be done by tag in Confirming visual castration does

not confirm the animal does not have a recessed testicle. A recessed testicle is cause for elimination

from show under ODA rules.

Stall/Pen Reservations: Pen reservation information for market animals will be collected at skillathon.

Fair Weights: Minimum 50# No Maximum limit

Fair Weigh-in Times: Wednesday of fair, 4-5pm. Animal must be in barn by weigh-in time. NO reweighing OR late weighing.

Final decision of show animal must be made before end of weigh-in.

**Drug Use Forms:** Complete online form before animal goes across the scales. Animal is to be drug free at TIME OF WEIGH-

IN Parent Signature is required unless exhibitor is 18 years of age and older.

Care & Feeding at Fair: The care and feeding of the animal is the responsibility of the exhibitor until the sale. Any exhibitor who

does not feed and water animals properly can be asked, at the discretion of the appropriate committee

and/or Fair Board, to remove their exhibit from the fair.

**Grooming:** Market dairy goat must be clipped (clipped is defined as the removal of all hair except that below the

knees/hocks and head) prior to arriving at fair. Hair length must be  $\frac{1}{4}$ " or less by weigh in. Animals may be fit and groomed the hair on the knees and the hocks. Fitting stands are permitted in a designated area determined by the fair board. Washing of goats on show day will end 30 minutes before the market show. Surgical tail docking not allowed. Any product which changes, enhances or alters the natural color of an animal will not be permitted. Including but not limited to paints, dye, powder, non-clear ad-

hesive and foam or shoe polish. Reference ODA 901-19-33

**Showmanship:** PARTICIPATION REQUIRED to sell. MUST show own project animal to be eligible to sell Exceptions are

only accepted by the fair boards in extreme circumstances.

**Disqualifications:** Disqualification includes not being able to show and sell.

**Sale Deductions:** 5% of sale price deducted for facility upkeep, advertising & misc. expenses.

Sale Donation Policy: Announcement will take place after the animal is sold and will be announced as follows: Exhibitor

(name) is donating a portion of this sale to the (charity/project).

**Type of Sale:** Partial Terminal – Only Grand & Reserve Champion must go to slaughter

# Allowed: Two ducks in a pen. May order up to 6 birds and brothers and sisters may share spares. Each exhibitor is

limited to showing and selling only 2 market animals/pens (any combination) at the Barlow Independent

Fair.

Animal Age/Breed: Only special ordered birds (white pekin) may show and sell. Exhibitor limited to order up to 6. Only

drakes ordered. Exhibitors will not be penalized for hens sent. Ducks arrive mid July to be correct weight and age at fair time. Exhibitors will be notified by mail of duck arrival. Must have order sub-

mitted and paid for by April 18<sup>th</sup> to OSU Extension.

**Stall/Pen Reservations:** Pen reservation information for market animals will be collected at skillathon.

Fair Weights: Minimum 4 1/2# per duck. No Maximum

Fair Weigh-in Times: Wednesday of fair, 4-8pm (4-6pm exhibitors last names A-M / 6-8pm exhibitors last name N-Z) Animal

must be in barn by weigh-in time. All spare ducks will return home and will not be eligible to participate

at the fair. One time through the scale

Drug Use Forms: Complete online form before animal goes across the scales. Animal is to be drug free at TIME OF WEIGH-

IN Parent Signature is required unless exhibitor is 18 years of age and older.

Care & Feeding at Fair: The care and feeding of the animal is the responsibility of the exhibitor until the sale. Any exhibitor who

does not feed and water animals properly can be asked, at the discretion of the appropriate committee

and/or Fair Board, to remove their exhibit from the fair.

**Grooming:** Birds must dry before crossing scales at weigh in. Dirty ducks will not be permitted to show or sell.

Checked at weigh in. Any product which changes, enhances or alters the natural color of an animal will not be permitted. Including but not limited to paints, dye, powder, non-clear adhesive and foam or shoe

polish. Reference ODA 901-19-33

**Showmanship:** PARTICIPATION REQUIRED to sell. Winners in the Jr division ONLY required to move up to Intermediate.

MUST show own project animal to be eligible to sell. If own animal is not shown in showmanship, exhibitor will be disqualified in market classes and not allowed to sell. Exceptions are only accepted by the fair

boards in extreme circumstances.

**Disqualifications:** If one animal in a pen of 3 is DQ by judge, entire pen is DQ. If you bring 4 ducks, the others will return

home immediately following weigh in.

**Sale Deductions:** 5% of sale price deducted for facility upkeep, advertising & misc. expenses.

Sale Donation Policy: Announcement will take place after the animal is sold and will be announced as follows: Exhibitor

**Dehorning:** Must be hornless and healed by fair. Verified by fair vet.

Male Anatomy: Responsibility of Exhibitor & Parents-Castration must be done by tag in. Confirming visual castration

does not confirm the animal does not have a recessed testicle. A recessed testicle is cause for elimina-

tion from show under ODA rules.

Stall/Pen Reservations: Pen reservation information for market animals will be collected at skillathon.

Fair Weights: Minimum: 350# Maximum: 700# Only Barlow Fair tags permitted, all others must be removed.

**Fair Weigh-in Times:** Wednesday of fair, 5-8pm. Animal must be in barn by weigh-in time. NO reweighing OR late weighing.

Final decision of show animal must be made before end of weigh-in. Must be weaned, started on food,

and broke to lead by fair. Must wear neck rope & halter while in stall during the fair

**Drug Use Forms:** Not required.

Care & Feeding at Fair: The care and feeding of the animal is the responsibility of the exhibitor until the sale. Any exhibitor who

does not feed and water animals properly can be asked, at the discretion of the appropriate committee

and/or Fair Board, to remove their exhibit from the fair.

**Grooming:** Market feeder calves should be washed and blown dry before the show. Any product which changes,

enhances or alters the natural color of an animal will not be permitted. Including but not limited to paints, dye, powder, non-clear adhesive and foam or shoe polish. Reference ODA 901-19-33

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Bred and Owned: Feeder calves must come out of your own cow. Calf must be out of your own calf. Exhibitors will register

at weigh-in and qualifications for the award will be determined by show committee. The top placing bred and owned steer & heifer will compete in the showring for one overall bred & owned award.

**Showmanship:** PARTICIPATION REQUIRED to sell. MUST show own project animal to be eligible to sell

Grade Premiums: Grade premiums will be awarded in market classes as follows: Prime-\$10, Choice-\$8, Good-\$5. The Bar-

low Fair board feeder calf committee reserves the right to change these award amounts based in funds

available and numbers of animals.

**Disqualifications:** Disqualification includes not being able to show and sell.

Sale Deductions: 3% of sale price deducted for facility upkeep, advertising & misc. expenses. Cost of vaccinations & Jr. fair

pass included in 3%. If exhibitor elects nots to care for calf on Sunday, cost of caring for animal (\$50) will

be deducted.

**Vaccinations:** Will be vaccinated by the Fair Veterinarian at fair weigh-in
