THE JEANNE CLERY CAMPUS DISCLOSURE OF CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY AND CAMPUS CRIME ACT

Legal Requirements

The Campus Security Act requires colleges and universities to:

- publish an annual report every year by October that contains three years of campus crime statistics and certain campus security policy statements;
- disclose crime statistics for the campus, public areas immediately adjacent to or running through the campus, and certain non-campus facilities and remote classrooms. The statistics must be gathered from campus police or security, local law enforcement, and other university officials who have “significant responsibility for student and campus activities;”
- provide “timely warning” notices of those crimes that have occurred and that pose an ongoing “threat to students and employees;” and
- disclose in a public crime log “any crime that occurred on campus . . . or within the patrol jurisdiction of the campus police or the campus security department and is reported to the campus police or security department.”

The Ohio State University Police is responsible for preparing and distributing this report. We work with other departments and agencies to compile the information. We encourage members of the campus community to use this report as a guide for safe practices on and off campus. It is available on the Web at www.oardc.ohio-state.edu/police/. UNIVERSITY POLICE

University police officers are designated by statute as law enforcement officers for the university. They are empowered to use investigative authority on reasonable suspicion of crime, to search and arrest as authorized by law, and to use reasonable and necessary force to enforce the law and protect property. University police enforce laws regulating underage drinking, use of controlled substances, and possession of weapons. They also perform other duties requiring police assistance. They initiate police incident reports, investigate traffic crashes, and assist in response to fires and medical emergencies. University police officers must take an oath of office and meet all certifications and requirements set forth by the Ohio Revised Code and the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission.

In 2007, the Wooster campus police station was located on Station Drive, behind the OARDC Administration Building. Staffing includes a full-time assistant chief, a full-time sergeant, two full-time officers, and six part-time officers. Personnel are trained in First Aid and CPR, and three officers are certified Emergency Medical Technicians. The university police are the primary responsible law enforcement agency for university owned and operated properties. They provide daily patrols and twenty-four hour on-call service. In addition, a close cooperation has been developed with the Wooster post of the State Highway Patrol. The patrol provides dispatch services and their post is located on campus grounds.

With the central portion of the campus located in the city of Wooster, university police also have a mutual aid agreement with the Wooster police. This arrangement enhances working relationships between the two departments, which benefits the campus and local community in terms of crime prevention and emergency response.

PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY

While an attempt is made to provide the most secure surroundings possible without impeding the academic mission of the campus, all employees, students, and visitors must take some responsibility for their own personal safety. Although campus safety is enhanced through lighting, police patrols, and awareness programs, crime does occur. University police publishes crime statistics so that students, faculty, staff, and visitors will be aware of the potential for crime. We subscribe to the philosophy that publicizing crime and public safety information will help make the campus safer.

THEFT PREVENTION

The most frequent of campus crimes is theft. Student Affairs Risk Assessment has a program to mark your valuables with invisible ink. The UV/ID project is supported by various offices with materials available from residence hall RAs and the university police. Marking your property will help to establish ownership as well as promote recovery if an item is lost or stolen.



REPORTING CRIME

Prompt, accurate reporting of crimes or suspicious incidents is encouraged. Crimes or suspicious activity should be reported directly to the university police at 330-287-0111. Emergencies can be reported by dialing 9-1-1 twenty-four hours a day. Emergency call boxes are also located throughout campus and can be identified by the blue light. By pushing the button, you will be in telephone contact with a dispatcher and the blue light will begin to strobe to help pinpoint your location to responding emergency personnel.

Providing police patrols of the campus in highly visible and identifiable cars such as this one is part of our crime prevention efforts.



CONFIDENTIALITY

Ohio's public records law (Ohio Revised Code § 149.43) does not permit the university to promise confidentiality to those who report crimes to anyone except counselors at Student Success Services, or under certain circumstances, to a physician or nurse. Some off-campus reports also may be legally confidential, e.g. reports to clergy or health care professionals. Reports that are confidential by law will not be reported to the university for inclusion in the annual crime statistics report. Because of the requirements of public records laws, and counselor, medical, professional, and clerical confidentiality, The Ohio State University does not have a policy that permits confidential reporting of crimes to these individuals for inclusion in the annual crime statistics report.

SECURITY AWARENESS AND CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMS

The university police department is a member of the Ohio Crime Prevention Association, and they are active in crime prevention and liaison activities. Presentations are provided on rape awareness and education, alcohol and drug abuse, driving while under the influence, personal safety, crisis intervention, student orientations, parent orientations, employee orientations, security surveys, UV/ID, campus crime watch, and other public safety related information. In addition to the services provided by university police, other campus and community agencies are actively involved in crime prevention, counseling, and safety related services.

TIMELY WARNING POLICY

A campus crime alert is provided to give students, faculty, and staff timely notification of crimes that may present a threat to the campus community and to heighten safety awareness. The alert also seeks information that may lead to arrest and conviction of the offender when violent crimes against persons or major crimes against property have been reported to the police. The Ohio State University at Wooster will prepare a campus crime alert when a crime is reported to or brought to the attention of The Ohio State University Police Department and that crime represents a threat to the safety of members of the campus community. Every attempt will be made to distribute the alert within 12 hours of the time the incident is reported; however, the release is subject to the availability of accurate facts concerning the incident. Alerts are distributed via e-mail to on-campus offices, residence halls, and libraries, as well as printed postings in common areas, campus newsletters, and on the police web page.

Timely Warning

The Ohio State University Police at Wooster will prepare a dated campus crime alert upon receiving a report (such as a violent crime against a person or a particularly threatening crime against property on campus) that represents an ongoing danger to the safety of students, faculty, and staff.

Alerts will provide details of the crime, information on who to contact about the investigation, and if possible, a description of the suspect as well as crime prevention tips. Crime alerts will be widely distributed throughout campus, provided to campus media, posted on the Wooster campus police website when possible, and e-mailed as quickly as possible to select university offices. If the Wayne County Sheriff's Office or City of Wooster Police issues a news release about an off-campus crime that represents an ongoing threat to the safety of students, faculty, and staff, the university will assist in publicizing the crime on campus.



Campus crime alerts contain the following information:

1. A succinct statement of the incident.
2. Possible connection to previous incidents, if applicable.
3. Physical description of the suspect, if available.
4. Composite drawing of the suspect, if available.
5. Date and time the bulletin was released.
6. Other relevant and important information.



SEXUAL OFFENSES

Sexual assaults, including date/acquaintance rape, are a very serious concern of the university police. Sexual assault survivors are encouraged to contact the police, hospital, campus counselor, or Every Woman's House to get assistance. It is the policy of the university police to provide the following to survivors of sexual offenses:

1. We will meet with you privately, at a place of your choice in this area, to prepare a police report.
2. We will not release your name to the public or to the press during the course of the criminal investigation, without your consent.
3. Our officers will not prejudge you, and you will not be blamed for what occurred.
4. We will treat you and your particular case with courtesy, sensitivity, dignity, understanding, and professionalism.
5. If you feel more comfortable talking with a female or male officer, we will do our best to accommodate your request.
6. We will assist you in arranging for any hospital treatment or other medical needs, including transportation to a local hospital with a sexual assault nurse examiner.
7. We will assist you in privately contacting counseling, advocates, and other available resources.
8. We will fully investigate your case and will help you to achieve the best outcome. This may involve the arrest and full prosecution of the person responsible. You will be kept up-to-date on the progress of the investigation and/or prosecution.
9. We will continue to be available to answer questions, to explain the processes involved (prosecutor, courts, campus judicial, etc.), and to be a listening ear if you wish.
10. We will consider your case seriously regardless of your or any suspect's race, color, creed, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, age, disability, or Vietnam era veteran status.

The responsibility for tracking persons in Ohio who have been designated as Sexual Predators is assigned to the sheriffs of the various counties. The following web site contains information regarding sexual predators for geographic areas covered by this report:

JUDICIAL PROCESS — SEXUAL OFFENSES

Upon the completion of an investigation of a sexual offense reported to the university police, several things could happen. First, our case would be submitted to the Wayne County Prosecuting Attorney's Office for review. If the proper elements and evidence are present, the Prosecutor may pursue criminal charges against the suspect. At this point, the case would then proceed as any other criminal complaint before the court. The survivor may be required to testify, but will have support available through Every Woman's House, Victim's Assistance, and the continued support of the police department. In the event there is not enough evidence to proceed with a criminal case, or the survivor does not want to pursue a criminal case, other action may be taken. If the suspect is a student, he or she may be charged with a violation of the code of student conduct and be subject to a campus judicial hearing. If a student is found in violation of the code of student conduct, one or more sanctions could apply, which could lead to suspension or dismissal from The Ohio State University. The university may also immediately suspend a student who constitutes a clear danger to the university community or creates a substantial risk of injury to any person. If the alleged offender is not a student, further civil action may be available to the survivor or to the university. It should also be noted that criminal prosecution and university judicial action may be jointly or separately taken against a student. This does not present double jeopardy.

WORKPLACE VIOLENCE

The Ohio State University is committed to providing faculty, staff, and students with an environment that is safe, secure, and free from threats, intimidation, and violence. This includes providing a supportive workplace in which employees can discuss and seek assistance with workplace, family, and relationship violence occurring in their lives. Our goal is to provide a workplace in which violence of any kind is neither tolerated nor excused.

To promote an atmosphere that encourages learning and productive employment, quick responsive action will be taken if violence or the threat of violence arises.

Here is a list of conduct or behavior not tolerated by the university:

- A. Direct or implied threats
- B. Physical conduct that results in harm to people or property
- C. Possession of deadly weapons on university property
- D. Intimidating conduct or harassment that disrupts the work environment or results in fear for personal safety (e.g. stalking)
- E. Use of university property or resources such as work time, telephones, fax machines, mail, e-mail, internet, or other means to threaten, harass, or abuse someone

Individuals found to engage in behavior in violation of this policy will be subject to corrective action, up to and including termination. Criminal charges may also be filed, as appropriate. The university will take reasonable steps to respect the confidentiality and autonomy of the victim in a reported situation of workplace or family and relationship violence, to the extent allowed by law. Perpetrators of workplace and family and relationship violence occurring in the workplace may be required to seek and successfully complete training, counseling, or treatment. The University Faculty and Staff Assistance Program can provide counseling and/or referrals to a family and relationship violence perpetrators' treatment program.

Violations of the policy can be reported to an appropriate administrator (e.g. immediate supervisor, department head, human resource officer, university police, Office of Human Resources, and Consulting Services).

CAMPUS FACILITIES

During autumn, winter, and spring quarters, Halterman Hall and Skou Hall are open from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Summer quarter hours for campus facilities will be posted at a later date. OSU ATI offices are open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily (closed weekends and holidays). OARDC buildings are usually open during normal week-day business hours, but certain restrictions for admittance may apply. It is recommended that individual departments be contacted for further information. Building security on campus is controlled by key or card access.

Under state law, smoking inside buildings is prohibited. Also, firearms, regardless of whether a person has a conceal carry permit, are prohibited on university property, and it is unlawful to bring them into any university building. University policy also prohibits bicycles, skateboards, and rollerblades inside buildings.

There are no off-campus facilities for student organizations.

HOUSING

The Department of University Housing provides on-campus housing for 185 students at the ATI Residence Hall and approximately 350 at Applewood Village. Residential Assistants live on each of the three floors at the Hall, and four RA's and the Housing Coordinator and Assistant Housing Coordinator live in the Village. For personal safety, residents are advised to adhere to the rules and regulations of University Housing and the terms of their contract, which promote safety of residents while living on campus. Exterior Hall entrances are locked at all times and are operated by residents' BuckID cards. Key control for the Residence Hall and Village is maintained through their office.

Student staff is trained by various faculty and staff, including a session with the university police. Housing staff provide floor meetings and other programs that address many issues including safety, security, drugs and alcohol, human dignity, and other important topics, which lead towards a more harmonious and safe living environment.

CRIME STATISTICS

Definitions Of Reportable Crimes

Criminal Homicide

- *Murder* and *non-negligent manslaughter* are defined as the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
- *Negligent manslaughter* is defined as the killing of another person through gross negligence.

Sexual Offenses

- A forcible sex offense is any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will. A forcible sex offense can also be defined as any sexual act directed non-forcibly or not against a person's will when the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity (or because of his/her youth).
- Non-forcible sex offenses are incidents of unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse. Only two types of offenses are included:
 - Incest is defined as sexual intercourse between two persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.
 - Statutory rape is defined as sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.

Robbery

The act of taking or attempting to take, whether by force/violence, threat of force/violence, or infliction of fear, anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons.

Aggravated Assault

An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by a means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. (It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when the use of a gun, knife, or other weapon could and probably would have resulted in serious personal injury had the crime been successfully completed.)

Burglary

The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. For reporting purposes, this definition includes unlawful entry with intent to commit a larceny or a felony, breaking and entering with intent to commit a larceny, housebreaking, safecracking, and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned acts.

Motor Vehicle Theft

The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. (Motor vehicle theft is classified as any case where an automobile is taken by a person not having lawful access, even if the vehicle is later abandoned, including joy riding.)

Arson

Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

Other Offenses

- Liquor law violations. The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacturing, selling, transporting, furnishing, and possessing of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on a train or public conveyance; and attempting to commit any of the aforementioned activities. (Drunkenness and driving under the influence are not included in this definition.)
- Drug abuse violations. Violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. The relevant substances include opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine), marijuana, synthetic narcotics (Demerol, methadone), and dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, Benzedrine).
- Weapon law violations. The violation of laws or ordinances dealing with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as the manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons; the carrying of deadly weapons, concealed or openly; the furnishing of deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned acts.

The following crime statistics originated from The Ohio State University Wooster campus (ATI and OARDC) and its operations. The first column represents the total reported on campus while the second column breaks out how many of the total occurred in campus residential areas. The third column represents activity on non-campus operations (e.g. ATI Dairy, Equine, etc.). The last column represents public areas immediately adjacent to the central campus. The classifications listed are those mandated by the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy & Campus Crime Statistics Act and do not include all reported criminal offenses to The Ohio State University Police at Wooster. Complete offense listings are available online or at the police station.



JURISDICTION OF OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY POLICE

The map below depicts the central campus of The Ohio State University at Wooster. This is the "On Campus" area as reported in the previous crime statistic tables. The area west of Madison Avenue and south of Dover Road, with the exception of the Residence Hall, is private property. The rest of the area is university property, and the responsible law enforcement agency is The Ohio State University Police. The other areas are within the jurisdiction of the Wooster Police Department and the Wayne County Sheriff.



DAILY CRIME LOG

OSU police at Wooster maintains a daily log that records by number, date, general campus location, officer assigned, nature of incident, and status of all criminal and non-criminal reports received. 
